President Dave Krumpholz presided.

1. Last call for Ducky Derby Tickets
2. The Young Children: Priority One committee asked members to bring school supplies to our next meeting, on August 24th, for students at Twinbrook Elementary School in Rockville. A list of needed supplies was passed out, and will be emailed to members, as well.
3. The signup sheet for working at The Maryland Wine Festival, on September 17-18, was circulated again.
4. Rose Ann from the Lions Club read a letter of thanks to our club for volunteering at their carnival this year. She presented a certificate to Dave Krumpholz. She also announced that the Lions will be having a volunteer thank-you dinner on December 13, which will be a Christmas party.

Program

Jim Jacobs, Service Leadership Programs Committee chair, gave the program. Diane DeAtley, representing the newly chartered Builders Club at Mount Airy Middle School, was introduced, as was Jeremy Brown from the new Key Club at Linganore High School. Stephanie Feinberg and Sara Debnam showed a video of some of the events/activities which the South Carroll Key Club had done during the year.

August 24 Meeting

Guests were Elaine Krumpholz, Connor and Fred Dowell, and Kiwanis Division 9 Lieutenant Governor Renee Mackey.

President Dave Krumpholz presided.

1. Paul Clay had copies of the new Mt. Airy telephone book; he stated that the books will be delivered to all residents at the end of the week. He showed some comparisons from the previous year, and noted that suggestions for future issues are always welcome.
2. As the incoming club president, Paul also asked for volunteers to chair committees this coming year, or to sign up as a member of a committee.
3. Beth Jacobs thanked everyone for bringing school supply donations for the Twinbrook Elementary School.
4. The signup sheet for the Maryland Wine Festival on September 17 and 18 was circulated again.
5. Connor Dowell from Boy Scout Troop 460 presented his Eagle Scout Badge project – to plant butterfly trees at the Audubon Sanctuary, and requested financial help. We presented him with a check for \$160.

Program

Club members who had attended the Capital District Convention in Williamsburg VA spoke, including Marion Taylor, Jeri Simon, Dave Krumpholz, and Stephanie Feinberg. Dave handed out a flyer from the convention, entitled Connecting with E's! - Educate, Engage, Empower, listing ways clubs can grow in membership and improve on their service to the community.

Minutes of the July Board Meeting – 08/03/11

President Dave called the meeting to order at 6:35 pm.

Kiwanis Lt. Gov. Renee Mackey and Key Club Lt. Gov. Stephanie Feinberg attended.

Old Business

1. Status of membership photos - Per Dave, Chuck Botts reported that he should have the albums completed by early September.
2. Chamber Designates – August, Rick Campitelli; September, Bill Butts; October, Tom Walker.
3. Community Analysis – Bill Butts reported that the final analysis should be ready by early September. All findings will be posted on a website for comments by the community leaders. He also stated that he would like the Board to review the project list for discussion on opportunities that we could participate in and would like to hold discussions at the community level to develop a plan to move forward.
4. 93rd Capital District Convention – August 19-21, 2011. Dave, Marion and Jeri are registered to attend and will provide the club with a synopsis of the event at our regular meeting on August 24th. Stephanie reported that she is also planning to attend.
5. SC Key Club's summer project – cleaning up the school's courtyard. Dates and times are: Friday, August 5, 8-12 am; and Wednesday, August 10, 5-8 pm.
6. LLC Phone Book - Paul Clay reported that on 8/1 there were several issues with the printer to resolve. On 8/2 those issues were fixed but another one appeared. That issue has also been fixed and a hard copy is being prepared for final scrutiny before printing all copies. The printer said the books should be delivered to the post office by the middle of August.
7. Fireman's Carnival Parade on July 28th. – Those who attended said “it was a great event enjoyed by all!” About 1,400 beads were handed out with the help of several (eleven) Builders Club and Key Club members. Chuck Botts took several pictures and Jim stated that he will show them to the club in August.
8. Fall Pancake Breakfast – Angie reported that Calvary United Methodist Church has cleared its calendar for November 19th so we can hold our breakfast event in their hall. She also stated that we need to contact the other service clubs to make them aware of this change.
9. Paul brought up the issue of replacing our table-top double burner – he found an example on e-bay under \$50. Jim also found a nice free-standing triple burner at Costco for about \$150 which would be safer to use and more versatile for the types of events we participate in. After some discussion, Angie made a motion to purchase the burner at Costco, seconded by Jeri Simon and so approved by the Board. Dave said he would make the purchase.

New Business

- Club Budget Planning Worksheet – Dave said he will prepare a budget draft based on Angie’s figures by August 15th so the Board and committees can begin reviewing for next year’s proposals.
- ELIMINATE Project – After some discussion it was decided that this should be added to our budget as a line item in Community Service. Lt. Gov. Renee explained how this project is operating in partnership with UNICEF and that funds had to be reserved to cover booster shots for the next five years. She added that International would like each club to commit to \$750 for the five year period but there was some confusion as to whether that was per member or per club. She also reiterated that donations could not be used for a Hixson. She will get clarification on the donation issue.
- Jim asked the Board about including the Aid for Africa Project in the next budget as it could be earmarked for service projects. The Board agreed it would be taken into consideration and Glee added that it would be a good project for the Builders Club. She also stated that we should continue to have speakers for these types of groups to expand our awareness for international needs. A decision to commit will be tabled to the next board meeting.
- Bill presented a new display to use at new member inductions. He explained the purpose of each component and asked the Board to consider giving some type of recognition to the craftsman who created it as he would not accept any monetary retribution. The Board agreed and will make arrangements to invite him to a meeting when we induct new members.

As there was no other business to discuss, Bill made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Jeri and the meeting was ended at 8:02 pm.
